Troparion

When the stone had been sealed by the Jews, while the soldiers were guarding Thy most pure body, Thou didst rise on the third day, O Savior, granting life to the world. The powers of heaven therefore cried to Thee, O Giver of Life: “Glory to Thy Resurrection, O Christ! Glory to Thy Kingdom! Glory to Thy dispensation, O Thou Who lovest mankind!”

Troparion for St. Sava

As an instructor, and hierarch, and teacher of the Way that leads to life, you first came and enlightened your homeland, O Saint Sava, and causing it to be reborn by the Holy Spirit, you planted your wholly sanctified children as olive trees in a spiritual paradise, therefore, honoring you as equal to the Apostles and saints, we beseech you: Entreat Christ God to grant us great mercy.

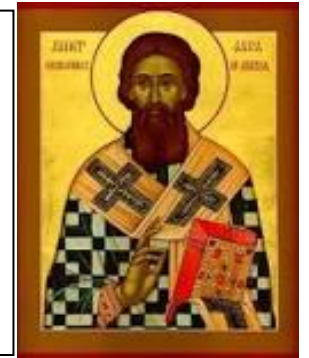
Kontakion

As God, Thou didst rise from the tomb in glory, raising the world with Thyself. Human nature praises Thee as God, for death has vanished. Adam exults, O Master! Eve rejoices, for she is freed from bondage and cries to Thee: “Thou art the Giver of Resurrection to all, O Christ!”

Kontakion for St. Sava

Your church glorifies you as its first great hierarch and the Apostles’ companion, O venerable one. Since you have boldness before Christ God, save us by your prayers from every tribulation, so that we may cry to you rejoice, O divinely wise Father Sava!

The legacy of Saint Sava lives on in the Orthodox Church traditions of Slavic nations. He is associated with the introduction of the Jerusalem Typikon as the basis for Slavic Monastic Rules. The Serbian Hilandar monastery on Mt. Athos lives by the Typikon of Saint Sava to this day. In 1270 the first copy of The Rudder of Saint Sava was sent from Bulgaria to Kiev. Editions of The Rudder are the most widely disseminated in the Russian Church. A printed Rudder was published in 1653, and often reprinted. Such was the legacy of Saint Sava to the canonical treasury of Orthodoxy.
