Troparion (Resurrection)

When the stone had been sealed by the Jews, while the soldiers were guarding Thy most pure body, Thou didst rise on the third day, O Savior, granting life to the world. The powers of heaven therefore cried to Thee, O Giver of Life: “Glory to Thy Resurrection, O Christ! Glory to Thy Kingdom! Glory to Thy dispensation, O Thou Who lovest mankind!”

Troparion (St. Gregory Palamas)

O light of Orthodoxy, teacher of the Church, its confirmation, O ideal of monks and invincible champion of theologians, O wonderworking Gregory, glory of Thessalonica and preacher of grace, always intercede before the Lord that our souls may be saved!

Kontakion (St. Gregory Palamas)

Holy and divine instrument of wisdom, joyful trumpet of theology, together we sing thy praises, O God-inspired Gregory. Since thou now standest before the Original Mind, guide our minds to Him, O Father, so that we may sing to thee: “Rejoice, preacher of grace!”

Kontakion (Lenten Triodion)

Now is the time for action! Judgment is at the doors! So let us rise and fast, offering alms with tears of compunction and crying: “Our sins are more in number than the sands of the sea; but forgive us, O Master of all, so that we may receive the incorruptible crowns!”

St. Gregory (1296-1359) was a gifted well educated 20yr. old when he first went to Mt. Athos to undertake his spiritual struggles in ascetism. He lived in various monasteries developing his use of mental prayer (or prayer of the heart), solitude and quiet, known as “Hesychasm”. For many years he defended its relevance and truth against the criticism and heresy of a philosopher, Barlaam. He suffered persecution and imprisonment during the disputes, eventually writing a “Triad” and other texts which were accepted by three 14th century Church Councils vindicating him and Hesychasm. It was known as the second triumph of Orthodoxy. He was set free in 1347 and named bishop of Thessalonika. Read more [here](#).
