Troparion (Resurrection)

The angelic powers were at Your tomb; the guards became as dead men. Mary stood by Your grave, seeking Your most pure body. You took hell captive, not being tempted by it. You came to the Virgin, granting life.

Troparion (Forefeast)

Prepare, O Zebulon, and adorn thyself, O Naphtali! River Jordan, cease flowing, and receive with joy the Master coming to be baptized! Adam, rejoice with our first Mother, and do not hide yourselves as you did of old in Paradise; for having seen you naked, He has appeared to clothe you with the first garment. Christ has appeared to renew all creation.

Troparion (St. Seraphim)

Thou didst love Christ from thy youth, O blessed one, and, longing to work for Him alone, thou didst struggle in the wilderness in constant prayer and labor. With penitent heart and great love for Christ thou wast favored by the Mother of God. Therefore we cry to thee: "Save us by thy prayers, venerable Seraphim, our father!"

Forsaking the beauty as well as the corruption of this world, thou didst settle in the monastery of Saróv, O Saint. There thou didst live an angelic life, becoming for many the way to salvation. Therefore, Christ has glorified thee, O Father Seraphim, enriching thee with abundant healing and miracles. So we cry to thee: Save us by thy prayers, venerable Seraphim, our father!

Kontakion (Forefeast)

Today the Lord enters the Jordan and cries out to John: "Do not be afraid to baptize Me. For I have come to save Adam, the first-formed man."
